Executive Summary

In 2023, School Safety Outreach successfully implemented various programs aimed at disaster risk management, disaster response, and education in emergencies. We strengthened our partnerships, expanded our reach, and saw positive outcomes in schools and communities.

Our financial performance remained robust, with a slight increase in donor contributions. Major initiatives included the rollout of a comprehensive toilet hygiene campaign and the establishment of a disinfection team.

Year in review

Highlights:

- Disinfected selected schools in preparation for school resumption.
- Successful Education in Emergency programs in Wokaka, Lysoka, and Upper Bolifamba.
- Conducted a workshop on psychosocial support in Meme.
- Launched a cholera awareness campaign in Fako Division.

Program Descriptions and Outcomes

Cholera awareness campaign:

- Carried out sensitization on cholera prevention measures in 63 schools and communities affected by the 2022 cholera outbreak in Fako Division.
- Donated 63 WASH kits to vulnerable schools.
- Distributed 601 SSO Cholera Prevention Tips flyers in 63 schools.
- Organized seminars and workshops in 23 schools.

Road safety campaign:

• Carried out safety awareness raising among road users and the student population in 28 schools located along the roadside.

- Assisted under 11 (pupils) to safely cross the road before and after school in
 15 primary schools located along the roadside.
- Assisted students to safely cross the road before and after school in 13 secondary schools located along the roadside.
- Worked in cooperation with 5 municipal councils to develop road safety signs on roads located around schools.
- Trained 150 taxi drivers on road safety measures.

Climate Friendly Schools:

• Organized seminars and workshops with learners and staff on climate change and its impacts on education in 47 schools.

- Carried out environmental awareness campaign prior to the planting of oak trees in 47 schools.
- Trained 239 students on how to raise tree nurseries, plant and care for trees.
- Monitoring and evaluation of indicators

Education in Emergency:

- Provided access to education in 5 communities affected by the anglophone crises.
- Carried out monitoring and impartial evaluation of education response activities in 13 schools.

Child Protection:

- Set up child-friendly spaces to support children's mental health through safe play in 15 localities affected by the anglophone crisis.
- Implemented programs to help vulnerable children develop social and emotional skills.
- Supported 220 underprivileged children who are not going to school in crises affected communities.






